Red Rutherford was ill and unable to attend the dinner but sent a report on the status of the Transportation Museum. Of the people present at the meeting, 38 supported the idea of a museum and 21 would park a car there. Red Rutherford said he will

donate 3 cars to the museum and asked if there were other people who would be willing to donate either money or cars to the museum.

Jack Yale is to look into what needs to be done so that all monies donated will be kept separate from club funds. If we find that we cannot get a museum started all donated monies and cars would then be returned to those who donated them.

Roy Holmes volunteered to chair a set-up committee to investigate the feasibility of the museum and the possibility that other clubs might also be interested in becoming involved in this activity.

A discussion was held on the need to increase the car club dues. Karla Jackson made a motion, seconded by Joe Kuhns to increase the dues to \$25 per year per family to be effective January 2006. After further discussion the motion passed.

Jack Yale was authorized to send a \$250 check to Hospice in memory of Bob Graves. Roy Holmes made a motion to support the Kennewick General Hospital golf fund raiser with a \$300 donation in memory of Jim Mokler. There was a second and the motion passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:35 p.m.

Although I could not be there from the beginning, from what I understand, you mix all the ingredients together, place them in the Dutch ovens. The Dutch ovens are then placed over coals and coals are also placed

on the lids as well. You can also stack them and cook multiple food items at the same time.

I did have the chance to sample the beef stew, the chicken enchilada casserole and several of the desserts. They were amazing. It was interesting to see the variety of menu

items that can be cooked this way. The menu consisted of salad, beef stew, chicken enchiladas, beer bread and for dessert there was blueberry buckle, pineapple upside down cake, and cake with cherries and there was brownies, although they were not cooked in a Dutch Oven. Beer Bread

- 3 Cups Self Rising Flour
- 3 Tsp Sugar
- 1 Beer Room Temperature

Form to bread pan or Dutch Oven. Dough will be a little sticky. Bake at 350 for 1 hour. This will do one loaf pan.



Dutch Oven Beef Stew

- 2-3 lbs Chuck cut into 1" cubes
- 1 Clove Garlic Minced
- 1 Large Onion Sliced
- 2 Bay Leaves (When stew is done CeeDub Welch says "feed them to the Coyotes")
- 6 Carrots Sliced
- 4 Potatoes Cubed
- 1 Can Cream of Mushroom soup
- 1 4oz Can of Mushrooms
- 1/2 Can of Coke (drink the rest)

Drench beef in flour, salt and pepper to taste. Brown in small amount of oil. Add rest of the ingredients to meat in Dutch oven or casserole dish if cooking in oven. Cook in Dutch oven for an hour. Test vegetables for doneness if cooking in oven. 350 degrees if cooking in oven.

Most of all don't forget the BEER BREAD!!
